Swiss national railway company SFR is the next biggest with 36%, followed by utilities Industrielle Werke Basel (IWB) with 15% and Canton-owned FMV with 10% of a total share capital of CHF350 million. Switzerland ranks 6th in Europe for pumped storage power plants, with 4,419 MW in 2022, or 7.8% of the European total, compared with 7,891 MW in Italy, 6,414 MW in Germany, 6,164 MW in Spain, 5,596 MW in Austria and 5,050 MW in France. The Nant de Drance power plant (900 MW) was commissioned with 6 variable-speed Francis pump turbines and a storage capacity of 20 GWh.
